# SUMMER CAMP at LAKESHORE CENTER What you need to know!

Whether this is your first summer at Lakeshore or your 60<sup>th</sup>, here's everything campers and families need to know about coming to camp this year!

### What's Camp like?

Camp is the best place on Earth! You'll get to spend all of your time hanging out with a cool counselor and an awesome cabin group while having a BLAST with fun games and great activities! Your cabin will be super comfy with air conditioning, private bath and changing rooms, and electricity! A regular day at camp looks like this: start with breakfast at 8, then energizers and worship, Bible study, activity blocks, lunch, rest time, more activities, snacks, swim time, cabin time, dinner, an evening event (like a huge game, campfire, or special event), vespers, cabin time, then bed around 9:30 (with some late-night activities for some campers).

### What do I need to bring?

When you get to camp all you'll need to have with you is a good attitude, all of your paperwork (be sure to have your health form!), and everything on the packing list.

You can find a packing list attached to your confirmation email after registering for camp, on the lakeshorecenteratokoboji.org website, or by contacting the Lakeshore office (712-337-3313). Make sure to leave everything on the "do not pack" side at home!

#### How do check-in and check-out work?

For most programs, try to show up no earlier than 3PM on Sunday. (We won't know what to do with you before then!) Please drive your car around the circle in front of the Chapel and stop at each station in order. First, you will reach the check-in station where forms are filled out, your camper is checked in, canteen money is turned in (to save time, you can make this payment online or you can download our canteen form from the confirmation email or from our website), and any outstanding balances are taken care of. If you have any payments to make, please bring them in the form of personal check or cash. Then, you will stop at the health check station where your camper's health screening will take place and meds are checked in. Meds need to be in their original containers, in a clear plastic bag, with the camper's name on it. Any questions, concerns, important information, or updates to the health form should be shared with our health team at this time. Last, you will stop at the unloading station, where campers' luggage is unloaded into their cabin's designated space. Give your camper a big hug and tell them you will see them in a week as they go to join their cabin group. Lastly, you drive away. It's just that simple!

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At check-out, you will drive toward the gazebo. A staff member will greet you, show you where to park, and notify your camper, who will then join you. You will then sign your camper out and receive a collection of documents going over campers' week at camp, meds, and other information. Proceed around the circle and stop at your camper's designated luggage location to collect their things. Campers **may not** leave before they have been signed out by an authorized adult. The official check-out time is 4pm, and any parent who fails to pick up their camper by 4:30pm may be charged a late pick-up fee.

Fast Camp and Blast Off! Check-in begins at 4PM, Monday, July 5th Grands & Family Camp check-in is located in the Lodge on Monday, July 5th Sheep & Shepherds check-in is at 5pm on Friday, July 9th
