

LAKESHORE'S 2021 COVID POLICIES

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, this summer at Lakeshore will look a bit different from summers in the past. There is no way to guarantee that anyone at camp will not come into contact with the virus, but by following this guide, we can mitigate as much risk as possible. These new procedures will be a change for everyone, staff included. Please be patient and ask questions as needed. We're all in this together!

Before Camp

Lakeshore recommends that all campers, guests, families, and staff receive a COVID-19 vaccination as soon as they are able. We also recommend that campers and families practice good social distancing at by staying home as much as possible, especially in the 14 days leading up to your time at camp. If your camper develops any COVID-like symptoms leading up to camp, please notify us.

Check-in and Check-out Procedures

At check-in day, please drive your car around the circle in front of the chapel and stop at each station in order. First, you will reach the check-in table where any outstanding balances are taken care of and your camper will be checked in for camp. Next, you will stop at the health check table where your camper's health screening will take place and meds are checked in. Last, you will stop at the unloading station, where campers' luggage is unloaded into their cabin's designated space. Give your camper a big hug and tell them you will see them in a week as they go to join their cabin group. Then, you drive away. It's just that simple!

At check-out, you will drive toward the gazebo. A staff member will greet you, show you where to park, and notify your camper, who will then join you. You will sign your camper out and receive a collection of documents going over campers' week at camp and other information. Proceed around the circle and stop at your camper's designated luggage location to collect their things. Then, you can hit the road!

Cohorts

To limit contact and assist in contact-tracing, campers will spend their time at camp in cohort groups. These will consist of combinations of cabin groups totaling 25 or less people including counselors. Campers will do all activities in these groups and contact with other campers or staff outside of these cohorts will be very limited.

Keeping things outdoors

Because of the magnifying effect indoor spaces have on viral transmission, we will be holding as many camp activities as possible outdoors. Campers, staff, and programs will move indoors for inclement weather and emergencies as needed. Indoor spaces will be sanitized after every use.

Masks

While in enclosed spaces with those outside of their cabin cohort, campers and staff will wear masks to the best of their abilities. Campers are required to pack at least 3 COVID-appropriate face masks, and Lakeshore will provide disposable masks as needed.
